### Catch a Bus.

The Regional Transportation District (RTD) operates Express and Regional bus routes along U.S. 36 between Boulder and Denver five days a week, and some Regional routes on weekends, too. Buses travel in both directions and make stops at the following park-n-Ride locations along the corridor: Westminster, U.S. 36 Church Ranch, Broomfield, U.S. 36 Flatiron Circle, U.S. 36 McCaslin and Table Mesa in Boulder.

Local buses serve most park-n-Rides, so consider taking a bus from your neighborhood to a park-n-Ride and connect easily to virtually any place in the greater metropolitan area by transit.

### Look for these Regional bus routes serving U.S. 36:

- **B, BX:** between Boulder Transit Center and RTD's Market Street Station
- **BF:** between Broomfield park-n-Ride and RTD's Market Street Station
- **DD:** between Boulder Transit Center and Colorado Boulevard
- **DM:** between Boulder Transit Center and University of Colorado Anschutz-Fitzsimons Campus
- **HX:** between 28th Street in Boulder and RTD's Civic Center Station
- **AB:** skyRide bus between Boulder Transit Center and points in-between and Denver International Airport
- **S:** between RTD's Market Street Station and East Boulder
- **T:** between Boulder at RTD's Table Mesa park-n-Ride and Denver Tech Center/ Greenwood Plaza

### Curb-to-Curb Service.

RTD's U.S. 36 call-n-Ride service completes the trip between park-n-Ride locations and

your home, office or other destinations within the service boundary. These buses do not have a fixed route or a specific schedule and will take you anywhere you need to go within a geographic boundary in Broomfield, Interlocken/Westmoor, Louisville and Superior. ### Share Your Ride.

Carpooling with co-workers or neighbors saves money, wear and tear on your vehicle and you ride free in HOT/HOV lanes. We also can work with employers to help arrange a vanpool for groups of four or more people or place individuals in existing vanpool routes. A guaranteed ride home is included with the service. ### Ride Your Bike.

Bicycling to work is safe and easier than you may think. All RTD buses are equipped with bike racks that accommodate two bikes and make "bike to bus" commutes viable, healthy, and enjoyable. If the bike rack is full, place your bike in the baggage bin available on Regional buses only.
